Get to Know a Winfield First Responder–Matt Smith

1. Where are you from and what brought you to Winfield?

I grew up in the small town of Burlington Illinois and my family had professional careers in business and teaching. After high school I joined our local fire department as a volunteer, and eventually, that department paid their volunteers a small stipend for each call we went to. I really enjoyed the work and the challenge, so I became a paramedic and started working in Wheaton as a contract medic (while still volunteering at home in Burlington). It was while I was working in Wheaton that I learned of an opening in Winfield, and since they allowed members to work as both Firefighters and Medics, I applied and was hired in Winfield in 2009.

2. Why did you become a Firefighter/Paramedic?

Nobody in my family was a Firefighter. I tried lots of things to find what I wanted to do, but I knew that I did not want a job that required me to wear a suit. I like to work with my hands and solve problems. Someone suggested I take an Intro to the Fire Service class while I was studying at Parkland College and found that I enjoyed the work.

3. What's the best part of your job in Winfield?

I never know what my day is going to be like. We have to think on our feet and adjust to each situation. We never get two calls that are the same. It's a lot of problem-solving and I am always challenged. You have to solve the problem because there is no option not to.

4. What are your professional goals?

I learned a lot about training and management

from my time in the Army. Once I started working in Winfield, I wanted to get involved in the training division to make improvements to both the daily operations and also improve our protocols and processes. It's important to me that everyone I work with is inspired to become a better leader because that makes us a better team. I attend training to improve my own leadership skills whenever I can and I am always working to improve the training pro-

gram for all the new members of our department.

5. What part of your job makes you most proud?

I feel proud of myself and my team when we're in the middle of a chaotic scene, and the crew I've trained with just clicks. When everything we practiced comes together seamlessly—everyone knows their role, executes it flawlessly, and the teamwork is effortless. In that moment, I know all the training paid off, and we performed exactly as we prepared. It's an incredible feeling to see it all work like it's supposed to.

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Winfield Resident Shares Her Passion for Cycling

For lifelong Winfield resident Mary Lee Geraghty, cycling has never been just about bikes-it's been about community, passion, and the many connections forged along the way. Now, after decades of helping others find their own joy on two wheels, Mary Lee is embarking on a new adventure: retirement.

Of course, "retirement" is a loose term for someone who's never been one to sit still. When I called to interview her for this story, she was in the middle of planning a 100-mile bike ride in California-proof that her love for cycling isn't slowing down anytime soon.

Mary Lee and her husband, Raymond, raised their four children in Winfield, where their oldest son, Michael, discovered a passion for bike racing. At the time, Prairie Path Cycles (PPC) had one of the strongest youth cycling teams in the country, coached by shop owner Mike Farrell. Mary Lee joined PPC part-time once her youngest started school. What started as a job quickly became something more-she found herself immersed in a world of riders, racers, and families whose lives revolved around cycling, just like hers. Over the years, she became store manager and eventually a co-owner, helping to expand PPC with a second location in Batavia.

Prairie Path Cycles was never just a business for Mary Lee-The shop became a place where she celebrated milestones, watched young riders grow, and formed friendships that lasted decades.

Here is an excerpt from her retirement announcement in January, "Reflecting on my time here, I

feel so fortunate to have shared countless special moments with so many of you. For some of you, I helped choose a baby carrier for your child-only to

umph of teaching a child (or even an adult!) to ride a bike for the very first time. Others entrusted me to help select the bike that turned your goals into reality, whether those were neighborhood rides, tackling hundreds of miles, or even crossing the country."

Beyond the shop, Mary Lee poured her energy into Athletes by Design, PPC's cycling club, which organizes races across northeastern Illinois, including the time trials and criterium in North Aurora and Winfield's annual Criterium each July. She loved being part of the racing scene but also saw an opportunity to expand beyond competition. She's helping shape the club's future by introducing casual and electric bike-friendly rides, ensuring there's a place for everyone-whether they're racing, exploring trails, or just enjoying a leisurely ride with friends.

Looking back, Mary Lee feels immense gratitude for the life she built around cycling. "We are so lucky to live in a place like Winfield, surrounded by incredible bike paths," she says. And she encourages everyone to get out and explore!

Prairie Path Cycles remains a cornerstone of the cycling community, and while Mary Lee is stepping away from day-to-day operations and moving on to new adventures, Mary Lee's love for cycling-and the people she's met through it will always be a part of her.

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Paving the Way—update on construction on Geneva & Winfield Rd.

The Geneva Road bridge construction project over the West Branch of the DuPage River started in August 2024 and is expected to be substantially completed by mid-2025. The Geneva Road bridge project is a joint undertaking between DuPage County and the Illinois Department of Transportation. Construction includes the removal of the

existing two-span concrete bridge and the construction of a new, single-span steel girder bridge. As construction progresses, motorists are encouraged to plan for traffic delays, alternative routes, and exercise caution when traveling near the work zone. Additional improvements will include retaining walls, sidewalks, drainage enhancements, pavement reconstruction, and the installation of a stormwater

storage facility.
In Illinois we have two seasons winter and construction. Construction on the Geneva Road bridge will be completed in multiple stages:
Pre-Stage: Daytime lane closures will be implemented to allow for preliminary storm sewer installation.

Stage 1: Geneva Road will close to westbound traffic between Winfield Road and west of the bridge. Eastbound traffic will be reduced to one lane while the northern half of the bridge is constructed. The designated detour route for westbound traffic will be County Farm Road to Roosevelt Road (IL 38), then northbound on Neltnor Boulevard (IL 59).

Stage 2: One lane of traffic in each direction will be open on the newly constructed north half of the bridge while the south half is replaced.

During the project, aerial utility lines along the north side of Geneva Road will be temporarily relocated to the south side before being restored to their original placement. Additionally, two separate buried utility lines require relocation to accommodate the new bridge and roadway infrastructure.

The cost of construction is \$7,867,988.00. Construction is paid for by federal and DuPage county funds. The following personnel are involved in this project:

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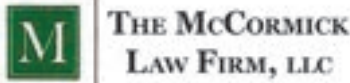

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Handling IRS Scammers

Hundreds of thousands of taxpayers are receiving texts, emails, or phone calls from fraudulent artists trying to convince you to pay them a fictitious IRS debt or to steal your personal information that they use to steal from you. There are many scams out there, for example “we will be coming to arrest you if you don’t pay this over the phone right now”, or they ask you to buy gift cards to mail in to pay of your debt, or they ask you go to Western Union and send them a payment, among many other fraudulent requests. They use the IRS because people get

extremely nervous when they think they have an IRS issue, be assured if you have any IRS issues you will receive a minimum of three letters before any collection action starts. My name is Michael J Michelin (630) 660-7780, I have been a CPA and resident in DuPage County for over 40 years, I am horrified every time I hear of a fellow resident being scammed. As a CPA I am well aware of the collection process and I will gladly offer my thoughts as a public service at no charge to anyone who receives any IRS request that they are not understanding. Feel free to call me and I will be able to help



you understand if it is a fraud or if it is legitimate. One final thought, if you are being pressured by someone like this about tax issues, simply tell them I have a CPA that handles my tax issues and I need to have him contact you, that alone will scare off most scammers.

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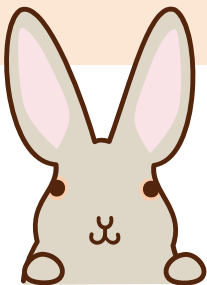

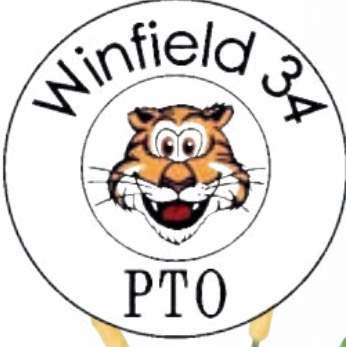

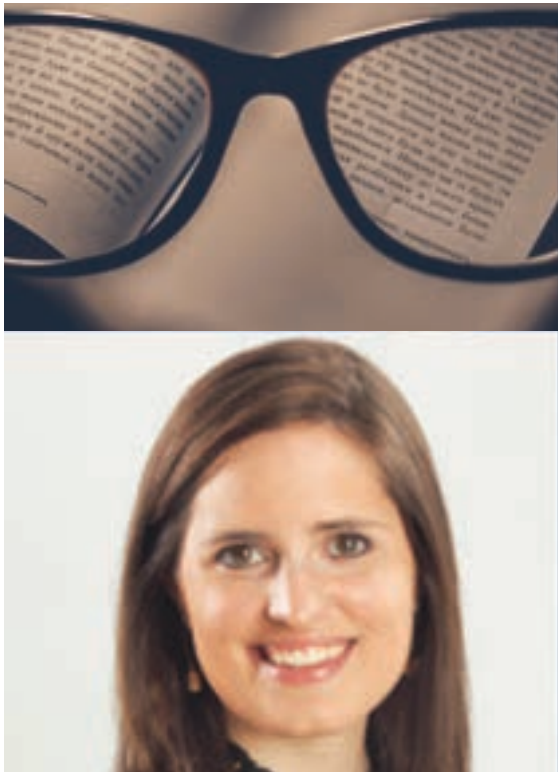


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Curt Barrett Stepping Down as Village Manager of Winfield

Barrett concludes his tenure as the longest-serving Village Manager in Winfield history

After 15 years leading the Village of Winfield as Village Manager, Curt Barrett is concluding his service at the end of April. Replacing Barrett on an interim basis will be Evan Summers, who served as Village Manager for the Village of Bensenville from 2016 to 2024. The two Village Managers are expected to overlap for about 60 days to ensure a smooth transition. The Village Board will vote at its February 20 meeting to approve Summers' contract, effective March 1.

Barrett's tenure in Winfield has coincided with a period of progress highlighted by new business investment, residential development and innovative additions to quality of life—including the Riverwalk Park bicycle and walking paths, bandshell, and new recreational and cultural programs. He leaves Winfield with an improved Aa2 bond rating and the strongest financial reserves position in the Village's modern history.

"Winfield has been fortunate to benefit from Curt Barrett's acumen and skill throughout my time as a Village Trustee and well before that," said Village Board President Carl Sorgatz. "He's been a terrific partner and will be missed by our community."

Village growth in the last decade has expanded to commercial corridors along North Avenue and Roosevelt Road, which provided a significant increase to the tax base. In recent years, Barrett led the visionary planning for Winfield's Town Center and stewarded negotiations between the Village and Northwestern Medicine Central DuPage Hospital that resulted in CDH's new parking deck being placed on the tax rolls.

"Curt really worked to bring the Village and Hospital together and find common ground to the benefit of both institutions," said Village Trustee Deb Piscola.

"I am thankful for the opportunity and support to lead the wonderful community of Winfield and its superb staff since 2009," said Barrett. "With the backing of thoughtful Village Boards, we have been able to grow Winfield's economy, make substantial infrastructure and amenity improvements, and achieve a record of notable financial stability."

Prior to joining the Village of Winfield, Barrett had a distinguished career serving in key management roles in DuPage County municipalities, including Glen Ellyn and Naperville.

In addition to Summers' most recent experience at the Village of Bensenville, he brings a background in administration and economic development roles at the City of Berwyn and the Berwyn Development Corporation. Like Barrett, Summers is a graduate of Indiana University.

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
